By now the agenda for the meeting at Pineglades will have been circulated to clubs and importantly the remits which are put forward for adoption by the delegates.

There is I venture to suggest nothing controversial in them and in reality are required to see our Incorporated Society status is able to be maintained under the new Act that is now in force.

In short there are some clauses required for us to comply with under the legislation and after consultation with my North Island Vice President the remits are seen by us to be necessary for our Constitution to be accepted for reregistration.

An election of officers is required for some positions and in particular my position as President,South Island VP,Treasurer, and Digital Platform Convenor.

There have been nominations or potential candidates for the last 3 positions, however, My position is one where I look to the clubs to provide a nomination as I will be standing down this year at the AGM.

It has been a pleasure to lead the executive as we debated the decision to rejoin the INF,to establish a code of conduct that could be adopted by clubs,and support clubs as they look to update their constitution to comply with the need to reregister the approved Constitution with the Registrar of Incorporated Societies.

Over the last 12 months I had hoped to visit clubs that I had not previously visited. Alas a health issue beset me around Easter and that put paid to travel out of Canterbury.I am grateful to the vice Presidents who have been able to visit clubs and in particular thanks to Paul C.who represented NZ at the world congress in Mexico and was also able to present AONC with a plaque on the 75th celebration in August. My term will conclude at the Pineglades club where the long awaited Come Fly With Us Festival will take place.

We can still accept registrations for the Festival and some day event tickets for New Years Eve and the catered dinner are available BUT, you need to act without delay as our committee must know final numbers for catering by 10th December.

We are looking forward as a club to hosting those who are travelling and assure you that this will be the new look approach to national get togethers. Sporting events will still be a focal point of daytime activities but the social and cultural benefits should not be lost sight of.

Plenty of good food and wine accompanied by social events should make for a fun filled 6 days. I therefore look forward to meeting you all that register and for those occupied elsewhere I wish you all a Merry Christmas and a prosperous New Year.

## THE MAGIC OF AUCKLAND'S WEST COAST BY MARK H

Having grown up in West Auckland near the Waitakere Ranges, the lure of Auckland's rugged West Coast beaches would always be stronger for me than the somewhat more timid East Coast Bays.

There's a 25km stretch of coastline that runs from Whatipu at the northern tip of the entrance to Manukau Harbour to the start of Muriwai Beach. Along the way some of the most spectacular beaches welcome visitors from all over the world. Whatipu-Karekare-Piha-Anawhata-Te Henga-Muriwai. Sir Edmund Hillary did much of his fitness preparation by hiking around the trails on the coast, and today there is the long Hillary Trail that commemorates this pioneering mountain climber.

One gem that is nestled between North Piha and Anawhata is the lesser well known White's Beach. Until recently, White's Beach was accessed by two routes. From North Piha, the Laird Thompson Track made a pathway up to Te Waha Point Lookout where you could look out across the expanse of the Tasman Sea. To your left is Piha and to your right is Whites Beach compactly nestled between two headlands. A further short climb leads to the Rose Track connection which wends its way down to the beach. Occasionally you might see a fisherman trying their luck at low tide, but often you can have the beach to yourself midweek. A word of warning, there are no lifeguards, the water is dangerous if you are not familiar with the West Coast beaches, and remember your shoes as these are black sand beaches and the sand gets hot!

The alternate route is from the Anawhata road at the Rose Track Trailhead 1km before the Anawhata carpark. Unfortunately, you'll likely spend most of the walk down the very steep 'driveway' contemplating the walk back up rather than taking in the view. Connecting with the Rose Track takes you to the beach. I recently visited North Piha and was devastated to see the landslide that has taken out the Laird Thompson Track making access to Whites Beach from North Piha impossible. Seeing what was hillside now sitting in a very large pile on the beach was heartbreaking. It certainly won't be an easy fix to get the track up and running again.

My love affair with Whites Beach goes back to the late 1970s as a teenager. Having arrived at the beach to find no one else in sight, I stripped off and swam in the waves at the water's edge. Returning to my towel, I saw no reason to put clothes back on so I lay naked in the sun. It was an amazing experience and a key moment for me in defining myself as a naturist. When two other people arrived at the beach, before I even had time to consider putting something on, they too had stripped off and headed for the water.

On my recent visit to North Piha I was asked by a tourist if the Laird Thompson Track was open. I sadly had to tell him it wasn't and the only route was a 20km drive away. I was gutted that he and his partner would miss out on spending time at Whites Beach. My hope is that one day a new track can somehow be created.

Today is a bit of an anniversary, it was 15 years ago that I left Cathy lying in the Australian bush naked as the day she was born as I ran off to get help, not knowing if she would be alive when I got back.

She had just been bitten by an <u>Eastern Brown</u> snake. That bite was part of the reason we now on the Tutukaka Coast in Northland with our own naturist paradise. But first, a bit more about Cathy's snakebite.

We were visiting <u>River Island</u> near Sydney. Early on our first morning we rose early, didn't put any clothes on, and went searching for platypus. How wonderful it was to just wander around in nature, completely without the barrier of clothes! Platypus are quite shy so we crept about peering through trees into the water. All was peaceful until Cathy stepped on a snake which promptly bit her.

We didn't quite know what to do. We were in the bush with no track or road, there was no mobile phone coverage and nobody knew where we were. Very quickly Cathy said her heart was racing and her head felt as if it were about to explode. She lay down, pale all over. I needed to get help, and quickly. My own heart racing with fright I sprinted off through the thick bush. Of course I was wearing nothing but shoes and Cathy later told me if this was going to be the last time she saw me at least the view was one worth clinging on to.

Getting to a phone I called the emergency services and a lifetime later a helicopter landed. This was pretty exciting to other visitors and much to the bemusement of the helicopter crew we were soon surround by a large gaggle of naked people.



Cathy was stretchered from the bush, into the helicopter and whisked off to Sydney where she stayed in emergency care for four days. One visit I brought her in a bag of gummy snakes which she promptly bit off their heads. We returned to River Island to continue our holiday, but no more sneaking around the bush. We carried long sticks to make a bit of noise with, and pretended we were Gandalf.

Circling back to the beginning of this story, and where we are today. For a few years before this 'exciting' holiday we had been thinking how we would like to live our lives with the kids leaving the nest. We wanted somewhere warm with a bit of land and had visited River Island to see what the general area was like. However, Australia had suddenly become less desirable.

Much searching later we spotted a lovely 18hA (50 acre) bush property in Northland and immediately knew it was for us. We were to become naturalist naturists. Most of the time there are no human sounds to be heard, just birds and sometimes the not-too-distant ocean. We have space and privacy to wander around sans clothes and enjoy the peace. And here we have stayed, working and visited by whanau and friends while developing shady <u>bush tracks</u> and running a popular naturist friendly <u>BnB</u>.

Our personal mission here is to leave behind a piece of Aotearoa better then we found it. This means getting rid of animal and plant pests and giving the land opportunity to recover to how it was hundreds of years ago.As a result we enjoy a healthy bird population including Kiwi, innumerable skinks and the more unusual <u>Mokopirirakau</u> (Forest Geko) and the carnivorous <u>pūpū-rangi</u> (Kauri Snail). Here the only hazards to our delicate skin is the occasional wasp and the spiky <u>Tātarāmoa</u> (Bush Lawyer) vine.

And most importantly there are no snakes!







# RISING TIDE

The early morning was chilly and damp, rain having just poured down only hours before. Some had brought umbrellas, which were now stashed in the secure clothing drop area which was guarded intently a few hundred metres away.

The Story Bridge would normally be criss-crossed with traffic, but now it was flooded with people. We stared up at the sky, blocked only by the iron girders, residual rain drops dripping from the arches that hung overhead and intersected. The wind that blew over the centre of the bridge was several degrees colder than the warm buzzing asphalt of the entrance, buttressed by the cold of the river it was suspended over.

There are few things in life more surreal than being among a crowd of 5500 nude Brisbanners laying down on a cold wet bridge at 6am on a Sunday morning. The sun had just risen, but we had yet to see it; the early morning cloud cover that hid the skyline was a kind of blessing. Among the sea of naked bodies, some bereft of sunscreen, we crossed our fingers that the Brisbane sun would be kind and spare us a slow reddish broil.

We had arrived in darkness an hour earlier, a spittle of rain drawing some trepidation. Chatty conversations, "Oh, you went to Peru, that's cool?", "The price of rentals in the city" (turns out Brisbane has the same problems as the rest of the world). We crossed the bridge from the south side and waited, glomming onto social groups and talking to assuage our awkwardness in that way you do when you let the butterflies in your stomach fly out and speak for you. People of all ages and professions -- retirees, students, call centre workers, influencers, awaited instruction from the cadre of team members with loudspeakers. The artist with a megaphone and assistants assembled on a stage lift, facing away from the edge of Fortitude Valley towards the south of the Story Bridge.

In one of the published photos from the event, a sea of bodies stretches out into the distance, from which two people in wheelchairs rise out of the midst, sitting some distance apart. They rise as lighthouses, perched on a sea of the vulnerable. Many people would have nightmares about this kind of event, driven by largely understandable fears.

The fear of humiliation, the fear of vulnerability, the fear of difference. It's easy to fall into the trap of acting awkward, distancing ourselves around people with clear differences, whether it be profession, race, gender expression, or ablebodiedness. For this reason, some folks find themselves sitting alone in a crowd.

Fear is of course human – and we all have that in common – but courage is also human. Let one rise up to wash away the other.

#### **Adventure Begins**

During the 2016 INF-FNI congress, we met Lofty and Amanda who were the representatives for the South Africa Naturist Federation, but also have a naturist tour company in South Africa. After that Lofty was always sending hints for us to come over and join in. Last year we finally gave in, and joined one of their trips in 2023 during November.

Lofty and Amanda live at a naturist resort called Sun Eden, which the residents often refer to as the farm. The base for this tour was Sun Eden, a resort on the edge of the Dinokeng Game Reserve, which is a project to develop "Big Five" wild animal sanctuaries in the northeastern part of Pretoria.

During the week the resort is clothing optional but in the weekend it is nude only everywhere, with the exception of the staff in the restaurant and reception. The bar, which is open in the weekend and staffed by young adults (19-23) who were like all patrons fully nude. We both thought that it felt like it was the way it meant to be in naturist resort and very positive that the young adults had no problem with being natural. We were really impressed with the layout, the facilities and the attention to safety evident in the resort and our tour as obviously South Africa has had a history that is concerning - we felt safe while over there and enjoyed the opportunity to see naturism developing differently. There were numerous social events that we could be part of, including the famous "braai" and karaoke evenings!

We met the founder and his partner in the bar and had an interesting discussion. The next day we set down for a historical conversation with Chicago Coetzee and Anneke, who had moved back to Sun Eden after a move to town.



#### A trip down memory lane and history

Chicago and wife Kathy began building in Sun Eden with Anneke moving there in 1997. There was a small toilet and building with a pumphouse built in 1995. They used a tractor to scrape out and deepen the dam (fed by springwater) to prevent it running dry. The original pool was built in 1995. It grew through word of mouth and they ran the place, building the bouma next to the bar. It became popular and they made a profit from the braii (bbq) and inclusiveness with the textile community



Chicago retired 2020, and said you guys can run it, recently the beautiful pool was built by Norman a former president who saw a picture of a pool in that style and built it.

Originally Sun Eden had no game except duiker and antelope, then they decided to get klosbok and wildebeest. The wildebeest were too wild! They ran through the pool area, and they had to go. Sun Eden then got impala, blesbok and njala and took advice from game rangers about numbers, stocking and feeding. Springboks came 2 years ago and all of these beautiful animals continue to provide delight to everyone.

The golf was a private venture by two members, Hanny and France built in the swampy area, dug it up, and put in a thatched roof area for watching birdlife.

Setting it up they considered carefully the mistakes they had seen in other naturist ventures. The Resort is share Block Company, bought and owned, and is a closed company which allows control over development, plans for building are submitted and there are controls on materials making the overall effect harmonious. The animals have determined some development e.g. the use of succulents in the garden!

The restaurant is run by Ben and is a great asset - we really enjoyed the variety of meals there.

It was our pleasure to meet Anneke and Chicago and be privileged to hear some of the history.

#### Back to the tour

We arrived at Sun Eden two days before the tour and the day after arrival, early in the morning we got a message from Lofty that Amanda was feeding the animals of the resort and if we wanted to come and watch while having a morning coffee with rusks. So nice to see Amanda feeding the impalas, springbok, blesbok and the many birds around the resort, what a way to start your morning. We made the effort to do this several times and Carley was also lucky enough to be invited by Amanda to see the glowworms at night which was spectacular. I loved seeing the range of birdlife, plants and animals. There was a huge fence around the resort that is regularly patrolled and one night a large porcupine broke through – we saw the footage the next day of the "intruder"!

In our guest house we also enjoyed watching the" bachelor boys" – a small group of impala – on their regular circuit around the resort, stopping to graze outside and keeping an eye out for the other large and small visitors.

One of our other tour guests had the slightly unexpected experience of a bushbaby in their hut. Very cute, very fast and – just close the door, the bushbaby had one room and they had the other.....



Later that morning we were invited to join Lofty and Amanda for an impromptu trip through the Dinokeng Game Reserve. This was our first introduction to some of the animals we would see during the whole tour, zebras, impalas, wildebeest, giraffes. springboks (not the rugby players), blesbok and many more.

The trip ended with a lunch at Arlington Brewery & Cidery in the middle of reserve, where Lofty and Hans, facing the right way, noticed a cat (lion like) animal passing the fence.

After everybody had arrived the tour could officially start, first stop an official game drive in Dinokeng, this was a different part of the reserve than the impromptu one and resulted in some different animals, many pumba (warthogs, a fave of Carleys) Rhinos and what about being face to face with Ostriches who refused to leave the road. A good start to the official tour, getting our animal spotting skills warmed up and ready.

The next day we left for Pilanseberg and on the way, we stopped at the Cradle of Humankind. This Maropeng visitor centre is an awardwinning facility, focusing on the development of humans and our ancestors over the past few million years. Apparently humankind was born in Maropeng.



Our accommodati on Pilanesberg was interesting, although not officially naturist, they did allow us to be nude there as Joxilox tours had hired the whole accommodati on.



We had two game drives through Pilanesberg National Park, a very early one and late early afternoon, as the animals are the most active round dusk and dawn. Only in the morning one we had seen four of South Africa's Big Five (lion, leopard, rhino, elephant, and African buffalo), and more pumba, birdlife, hippo and reptiles only missing out on the leopard which we did try to find in the evening but it became too dark to properly see it.

We did find some very startled elephant and rhino in our lights however! We want to thank our guide in that park who went over and above to make sure we saw as much as possible even to the extent that we were late back to the gate and he was shouted at by the gate keeper.

On the way back to Sun Eden we stopped at Lesedi Cultural Village, a great place to learn about the different tribes of South Africa.

Drumming skills were tested and we admired the passion of these people whose message was – come here and keep raising awareness for our country and our endangered animals.

The next day it was ladies day and we visited a diamond mine, we learned all about how we get those precious rocks heard about the history and the close calls with leopard that our tourguide had at one point. Incredible security there, all we can say is be prepared to hose off your shoes thoroughly!

On Sunday we were treated on a special traditional coffee and breakfast in the middle of the Dinokeng Game Reserve at the velde café. Often animals come there as there is water available but we were there on a quiet day – no matter we enjoyed the traditional coffee which is very similar to coffee had out camping.

The second week we went east from Sun Eden to the Graskop area, an area full of beautiful landscapes. We were able to go down into Graskop gorge, a beautiful bush area that reminded us of New Zealand and one of us ziplined across it while the rest captured the moment! Unfortunately, the weather let us a bit down and not of lack of attempts of our host, when we visited 'Gods Window', god had the curtains closed (mist).

We did enjoy many other beautiful landscapes while visiting the area and found a silk factory, which became an importune stop, great coffee and a real local woman's industry – a cultural highlight, not to mention great shopping for something authentic and local Amanda and Lofty are so knowledgeable and we learnt a lot about the areas we went through from them. We also stopped frequently for rest stops that were equally interesting and gave a good chance at sampling local food.

After the official tour ended we were invited to trial a visit to the Lion and Cheetah Sanctuary, a different experience than during the game parks. The Animals are in a smaller enclosed area, which makes it easier to see them, with the opportunity to pat a Cheetah and hear about conservation efforts. It was also our opportunity to get up close and learn about hyaena – wow they are incredible.

Many of the game tour rides and the ride through the sanctuary were adventures in themselves – changing landscape, an open vehicle clinging to a steeply turning road with big drops and.....is that a leopard in the tree? No, not this time!

It was a wonderful experience and good to see that so many younger people in South Africa enjoy naturism, maybe something we can learn from.

We loved it so much that – we are going back! -Together with our tour operator Joxilox, Amanda and Lofty who are so passionate, we designed a new naturist tour with more game drives.
